## GHOSTLY ENCOUNTERS IN OLD NEW YORK AND A SNAIL'S PHILOSOPHICAL QUEST ENLIVEN SPRING BOOKS FROM NEWBERY MEDALIST AVI

Acclaimed author Avi demonstrates his widely-praised versatility this spring with *The Seer of Shadows* (HarperCollins, April), a spooky ghost story; and *A Beginning, a Muddle and an End: The Right Way to Write Writing* (Harcourt, April), a charming fable about a would-be writer. *The Seer of Shadows,* a pulse-pounding adventure for readers ages 8-12, is a set in post-Civil War New York. The story encompasses intriguing details about spiritualism, early photography, and nineteenth-century race relations. *A Beginning, a Muddle and an End,* for all ages, imparts Avi's writing philosophy from the point of view of the entertaining duo, Avon the snail and Edward the ant, who were introduced in *The End of the Beginning*.

While A Beginning, a Muddle and an End is about the process of creating polished prose, The Seer of Shadows reveals Avi's literary expertise through the medium of historical fiction. The tale is told by 14-year-old Horace Carpetine, a photographer's apprentice who is unwillingly drawn into a scheme to swindle customers with fake "spirit photography." When Horace discovers that he actually *can* capture ghostly images in his photographs, he contends with both spectral and mortal adversaries who put him in great danger.

Readers who enjoy the evocative writing in *The Seer of Shadows* will be among those who delight in *A Beginning, a Muddle and an End,* Avi's humorous tale about why writing is a lot harder than it seems. Avon and Edward put their spin on the advice, "Write what you know," debate what separates fact from fiction, and discuss what constitutes a "must-read." Avon's funny and philosophical quest is a great read-aloud for younger children, while older children and adults will find deeper meaning in the clever wordplay and entertaining puns.

Avi is the author of more than 60 books. Among them are *Crispin: The Cross of Lead*, winner of the 2003 Newbery Medal; *Nothing but the Truth*, a Newbery Honor Book; *City of Light, City of Dark;* and the best-selling *Poppy* series. Avi's other novels with nineteenth-century settings include the Newbery Honor Book, *The True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle, The Man Who Was Poe, The Traitor's Gate, and The Barn.* Visit Avi online at <a href="www.avi-writer.com">www.avi-writer.com</a>.
